

What Are The Differences Between The Two 10" Table Saws?



W629 Vs W650

On paper, the 2 saws a have a very similar specification for cutting depth, ripping capacity, crosscut capacity & motor power. The same level of accuracy can also be achieved with either machine. The differences are in the construction of the 2 machines.

On the outside:



1) Rip Fence: The W650 has a more substantial rip fence design, using an industrial style polished solid steel bar. It is quicker to set and features a micro adjuster to enable fine adjustments to be made, for those times when a very accurate setting is required.

On the inside:



2) Cast iron trunnions: The W650 has cast iron trunnions securely held on a welded frame



3) Cast iron motor mount: The W650 has a heavy duty mounting bracket designed for professional users



4) Heavier control bars: used to control blade height, and blade tilt

In Summary

W629: We class this as a Light Trade machine, intended for the most demanding of hobby level users. For the average hobbyist, using the saw around 2 hours per week, it is a perfect fit and will have the durability to last for many years of service.

W650: We class this as a Trade machine, intended for professional users who earn a living from their work and therefore expect the machine is in daily use. The heavier construction and additional features on this machine allow a long life based on 10 hours use per week.
